Aimee Burns was a resident of Louisdale, Richmond County and much loved daughter of Lloyd and Emily Burns. We lost Aimee to a tragic car accident on June 22, 2010 at the age of 28. We not only lost a daughter but a true friend and one that loved sports to no end.
